Cookies for the Elizabeth Fry Society

The Outreach Committee is once again happy to support the women of the Elizabeth Fry Society. Your donation of home baked or store bought cookies would be greatly appreciated.

Please bring your cookies in a nonreturnable plastic container or paper bag on Saturday November 29 from 10:00 am - 12 noon. There will be baskets at the front door if you wish to drop off earlier in the week.

Their organization operates two residential facilities in the Peel-Halton region. Ellen House is an adult halfway house designed to accommodate ten women eighteen years of age and older from both the provincial and federal correctional systems. The Marjorie Amos Residence is a ten-bed open custody/ open detention facility for young women between the ages of 12-17 who are in conflict with the law. Their Mission Statement: We empower women and girls through a trauma informed, inclusive, and gender responsive lens. Our client-focused approach strengthens emotional, cultural and social well-being, through prevention, support, reintegration and advocacy.

These women and girls are so happy that someone has thought of them during the Christmas season. Thank you for your continued generosity.

The holidays can be a lonely time for many, especially those who have no family close by, and/or health and mobility issues preventing them from getting out of their home.

Local Peel long-term care facilities, retirement homes and churches have identified the seniors in our community most in need this time of year.

The Outreach committee are inviting you to donate items to this project on the same day as the Mitten Tree drive through on Saturday December 6th from 12-3pm. We will be decorating and filling these shoe boxes during this time.

Suggested items on what to include are: toothpaste, body wash, shampoo, lip balm, body lotion, tissues, hat, mitts, scarf, anti slip socks, journal, pens, pencils, small photo frame, word search books, playing cards, chocolates, hard candies, small flash light and a Christmas decoration. December Dates of Significance



December 1 - World AIDS Day



Since 1988, World AIDS Day has become one of the most recognized international health days. It raises awareness of the continuing struggles of those with HIV and commemorates those who have died. HIV remains a major health issue that affects millions of people worldwide. At the end of 2024, it is estimated that 40.8 million people were living with HIV. Of these 1.5 million are children (0-14 years old). The number of deaths from AIDS-related illnesses was about 630,000 people.

This year's theme is "Overcoming disruptions, transforming the AIDS response". Funding cuts for HIV services and their equal access, and the rise in punitive laws for AIDS sufferers and those in the LBGTQIA+ community have made international co-operation urgent to strengthen health systems and to advocate reforms to laws, policies and practices.

"In a time of crisis, the world must choose transformation over retreat," said Ms Byanyima, UNAIDS executive director. "Together, we can still end AIDS as a public health threat by 2030—if we act with urgency, unity, and unwavering commitment."

December 3 - International Day of Persons with Disabilities



First proclaimed in 1992, this day is about promoting understanding of disability issues and mobilizing support for the dignity, rights and well-being of persons with disabilities at every level of society.

It also celebrates the advantages to be derived from the inclusion of persons with disabilities at home, work, school and in all areas of community living.

The 2022 Canadian Survey on Disability shows that 27% of Canadians aged 15 years or older, or 8 million people, have one or more disabilities, and that 72% of people with disabilities experience barriers to accessibility in their day to day lives.

In 2025, the emphasis is on creating inclusive environments (home, school, work, community) that support the rights and participation of people with disabilities. The theme of the International Day of Disabled Persons 2025 is "Fostering Disability Inclusive Societies for Advancing Social Progress".

"Pause, Pray, Disrupt"



Political and military plans and actions imposed by Israel and its allies, esp. USA, on Palestine and the State of Palestine do not result in truth, justice, or peace. They produce more suffering by means of bombing and shooting of children and their parents, the denial of food and clean water and other necessities of life, the destruction of homes, schools, hospitals, churches and other essential infrastructure for fully human existence.

In fact although the Palestinian people are the targets for all this, any plans for ceasefire and reparations omit the involvement of Palestinians - as if they don't exist. There is no room for self-determination and fundamental human rights in the plans. There is no will to honour Palestinian rights to life in their ancestral lands - they are ethnically cleansed out, they are displaced to alien settings, they are massacred without mercy, they are starved to death.

Given this intractable reality, and given the laments and cries for solidarity of Palestinians, faithful people remember to rely on spiritual practices drawing on the divine Spirit to transform individuals, collectivities, institutions, and nations - and to be transformed themselves.



As a step in that direction, a solidarity team for Palestine invites you to participate in the practices of vigil (initiated in October by a team led by UCC Moderator Kim Heath), in a three-session Advent vigil entitled "Pause, Pray, Disrupt".

The Palestine Land Exercise (PLE) is an engaging educational experience that shares the history and background of the oppression of the Palestinian people from the beginning of the 20th century to today. In 2-3 hours this interactive exercise will explore the truth, through storytelling and documented history, about the major events that have led to Palestinian land dispossession, mass migration, starvation, and attempted cultural genocide. It will also uncover the persistent peaceful resistance and unwavering resilience of the Palestinian people, and urge participants to take up suggested actions of solidarity with them.

The truth about the Palestinian's situation is far different from the mainstream media's portrayal, and has many parallels with both the historic apartheid regime in South Africa and the oppression of the Indigenous peoples who live in what we call Canada.




