Mission and Service

This Easter, we are supporting Ukrainians as they heal from war.

Today's gift supports this and other crucial education programs across Canada and around the world!



The war in Ukraine has been raging for almost two full years. In that time, thousands of Ukrainians have been displaced: forced to leave their homes and move to safety elsewhere, either in another city, another country, or another continent entirely. Can you imagine what it would be like to have to pack up your entire life to flee from danger? How stressful and traumatic would that experience be?

In Sambir, Ukraine, a town west of Lviv, an English teacher is doing her best to help her fellow Ukrainians. She's running a class where the objective is not to get good grades or learn the curriculum, but rather to foster connection and relationships with each other through education.

The class—supported by Mission and Service partner ACT Alliance—is part of a broader psychosocial support program in Ukraine. Ilona gets her students to study at their own pace, using her classes as an excuse for displaced Ukrainians to meet and talk to each other and share their experiences. Learning in person—which is only possible thanks to your support—does so much more than teach English lessons: It creates community where there was none before. And in that community, these Ukrainian students can begin to process and heal from their trauma.

This Easter, we are working to encourage each other and build each other up (1 Thessalonians 5:11) through supporting education programs across Canada and around the world. Your gifts to Mission and Service support incredible programs—like this English class! Together, we can create new learning opportunities for people to come together.

March Dates of Significance

March 22 - World Water Day



World Water Day, on 22 March every year, is about focusing attention on the importance of water and raises awareness of two billion people living without access to safe water.

This year's theme "Leverage Water for Peace" highlights the critical role water plays in the stability and prosperity of the world. Tensions between communities arise when water is scarce, polluted, or unable to be accessed. The world must unite to protect and conserve this precious resource through agreements for shared water across borders and working toward the goal of safe water and sanitation for all.

March 23 - Earth Hour



Switch off and give an Hour for Earth on Saturday, March 23rd at 8:30 pm local time. Begun in 2007, "lights off" is an opportunity for people to reflect on environmental issues and our planet. Iconic buildings and landmarks from Europe to Asia to the Americas stand in darkness.

In addition, people are encouraged to dedicate an hour of their time during the week to fostering positive environmental change through messaging politicians, educating themselves, or joining groups to cleanup and restore natural habitats.

March 25 - International Day of Remembrance for the Victims of Slavery and the Transatlantic Slave Trade



For over 400 years, more than 15 million men, women and children were the victims of the horrendous transatlantic slave trade, one of the darkest chapters in human history.

Every year on 25 March, the International Day of Remembrance of the Victims of Slavery and the Transatlantic Slave Trade offers the opportunity to honour and remember those who suffered and died at the hands of the brutal slavery system. An outreach program has

been established to educate the public, especially young people, on the causes, consequences, and lessons of the slave trade and to raise awareness about the dangers of racism and prejudice today.
