### **Minister's Musings**

Every time I use my debit or credit cards, my bank notifies me with an email and/or text message. It is a security feature that brings me some comfort, but also some help with budgeting, as I am constantly alerted when I spend money! I also wear a blood sugar monitor that warns me if my blood sugar is dropping too low or climbing too high. And I get reminders on my phone to take certain medications or supplements and am alerted to incoming text messages or emails. These notifications all come with beeps and chimes – noise that accompanies my daily routines.

I have yet to find a phone application or 'reminder' that helps me to navigate my faith life. One that might notify me when my spiritual reserves are being spent, or when I need to take a dose of prayer or contemplation, or to merely sit with God. It would be lovely, I think, to get a signal from the Spirit that lets me know that God is loving me at that very moment. Would it sound like a chorus of angels, or perhaps dawn birdsong, or the whisper of wind through the fall leaves?

In our busy lives, it can perhaps be easy to overlook the signs and signals that God may be sending us. Do we see the face of Jesus and the call to act in the face of the man or woman standing at the highway off ramp asking for money? Do we notice God's love in the smile of a stranger? Do we hear God's Spirit calling us when we listen to the sounds of life in our neighbourhoods or buildings? Do we feel that God is loving us when we are reaching out to others in some way, or even when we feel most alone?

Perhaps I don't need that phone app to live a life of faith. Perhaps I just need to be looking, listening, feeling and doing – knowing that there are messages from God for me, and for all of us, in each and every moment of our days. No notifications required!





### **October Dates of Significance**



#### October 18- Persons Day in Canada



In 1927, five women who have since become known as the Famous Five launched a legal challenge that would mark a turning point for equality rights in Canada.

Emily Murphy, Nellie McClung, Louise McKinney, Irene Parlby and Henrietta Muir Edwards were journalists, politicians, reformers, and activists from Alberta who asked the Supreme Court of Canada to answer the following question: Does the word "person" in Section 24 of the *BNA Act* include female persons? After five weeks of debate, the Supreme Court decided that the word "person" did not include women.

The Famous Five did not give up the fight and took their case to the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council of Great Britain in London, which was then Canada's highest court of appeal. On October 18, 1929, Lord Sankey, Lord Chancellor of Great Britain, announced the decision: "The exclusion of women from all public offices is a relic of days more barbarous than ours. And to those who would ask why the word 'person' should include females, the obvious answer is, why should it not?"

This gave some women (not Indigenous women or those of Asian descent) the right to be appointed to the Senate of Canada and paved the way for women's increased participation in public and political life. On this day we also honour all those who have worked and continue to work to expand and strengthen these rights.

### Jubilee 2025: Turn Debt into Hope Campaign



Throughout history, and in the Bible, Jubilee years have been a call to restore justice by canceling debts, caring for people and the land, and addressing inequality. Today more than 50 countries are facing a severe debt crisis, with many governments forced to spend more on debt repayments to private creditors than on schools, hospitals, or protecting their communities from the worsening impacts of the climate emergency. In 2000 a global Jubilee campaign led to the cancelation of \$100 billion in debt for 36 indebted countries, but the structural reformation of the global financial system didn't occur, and indebtedness has risen to extreme levels once again.

In May of this year your Affirm Committee joined KAIROS Canada, Indigenous peoples, global partners, and movements around the world in making available a Jubilee 2025 petition calling upon world leaders to:

- Cancel unjust debts
- Reform the financial system to prevent future crises, and
- Establish a fair debt framework at the United Nations.

We had almost 30 people sign that petition then, but we're bringing it back the next two Sundays, October 12<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup>, for a couple of reasons. First, this timing coincides with the 2025 World Bank Group/International Monetary Fund (IMF) Annual Meetings, which run from October 13th-18th in Washington, DC, and the IMF convenes leaders and policymakers who can agree on solutions to the debt crisis. Second, the UN Climate Change Conference (COP30) begins on November 10th and the G20 meet November 22nd-23rd, and campaign organizers would like to get close to the 100,000 signatures petition goal by the time of COP30 in Belém, Brazil.

You can help reach that goal by both a) signing the petition at coffee hour if you haven't already (online signatures can be done here - <a href="https://kairoscanada.org/jubilee-2025-canada/petition-turn-debt-into-hope?ga=2.6865714.1885204500.1759863603-1504748355.1754615482">https://kairoscanada.org/jubilee-2025-canada/petition-turn-debt-into-hope?ga=2.6865714.1885204500.1759863603-1504748355.1754615482</a>), or b) taking a petition to your family, friends, or workplaces and encouraging more people to sign (we have some copies for you to take, and you can simply return them to us for mailing by Nov. 2nd). Help us Turn Debt Into Hope by showing the Canadian government that Canadians want global debt justice!
